



The graph above, based on data reported in the *Crime in Maryland: 2023 Uniform Crime Report,* illustrates reported rapes in Maryland Counties and includes data from statewide agencies.<sup>1</sup> As indicated, Anne Arundel, Baltimore City, Baltimore County, Montgomery County, and Prince George's County consistently exceeded other counties in reporting of rapes. Based on calculations, Maryland had a total of **2,100** reported rapes in 2023 and **2,055** in 2022. This represents a **2.2%** increase from 2022. This was the second highest number of total reported rapes in a single year in Maryland from 2019 to 2023.

Please note that although some jurisdictions saw a decrease in reports made in 2023, it does not necessarily mean that fewer sexual assaults occurred in 2023 than in 2022. Sexual assaults and rapes are still some of the most underreported crimes. This may be due to several barriers, including fear of retaliation, perception of insufficient evidence, fear of the criminal justice system, or belief that the police could not, or would not, help.
